- Read from your favorite classic children's books.

## Create a new event!

Here are some fun ideas for hosting a special Children's Book Week event:

- Create a community read-along.
- Throw a dress up party and encourage your guests to come as their favorite book characters.
- Create a scavenger hunt using book-themed clues.
- Host a book-themed craft party. You'll find excellent ideas here.
- Host a pajama reading party. Encourage kids to come dressed in their pajamas, and serve bedtime snacks like cookies and milk.
- Create a special Children's Book Week book club.
- Celebrate May the 4<sup>th</sup> with a special Star Wars celebration and reading.
- Host a special Mother's Day read-along.
- Invite a local educator to read from their favorite books and share the joy and importance of reading.
- Host a children's book trivia event.
- Invite a local TV or radio personality to give a reading from their favorite children's books.
- Host a puppet party. Have patrons make a puppet based on their favorite book character. Then put on a puppet show!



- Invite a local scientist or science teacher to host story time featuring their favorite non-fiction picture books.
- Invite a local language teacher to host a bilingual story hour, featuring books from another language and/or culture.
- Host a book-to-movie night. Bring out the popcorn and screen your favorite film adaptation of a children's book after reading aloud from the source.
- Using a <u>story starter</u>, have children create a chain story. Go around the room with each child adding a sentence or two to the story!

## Incorporate local businesses and organizations into your celebrations.

In our effort to expand Children's Book Week and instill a lifelong love of reading in every child, we encourage you to team up with other local businesses and organizations in your area:

- Partner with a local food establishment to provide snacks during your event.
- Team up with a children's sports league or afterschool activity program.
- Partner with a local petting zoo or animal shelter to host an event.
- Co-host an event with your local YMCA, Boys and Girls Club, Boy or Girl Scout troop, Community Center, or any other organization with programming geared towards kids.
- Team up with the local weekend farmer's market or nature center for an on-site, nature- inspired story time.
- Partner with a local bakery to provide treats for a literary tea.
- Co-host a multigenerational story time at your local community center or nursing home.
- Collaborate with your neighborhood park to lead a writing circle. Provide notebooks (or 'Spy Journals') for creative writing. Later, invite everyone to share their stories and observations.
